

As you know, I was called by the Session to minister amongst you as your Interim Pastor beginning on 14<sup>th</sup> November 2010. My report is therefore only from that time, but I would like to make a few brief comments on my journey with you all so far.

Firstly, I would like to thank everybody for the warm welcome you have extended to my wife Loraine and myself, which has made us "feel at home" so quickly. Secondly, because of the season of the year, with Christmas and the preparation for the Annual General Meeting, I have had to concentrate both on the Worship services and the work of the Session and Deacons during December and January. # CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE

With the year beginning on Rally Day, Sunday School classes began the following Sunday, September 19<sup>th</sup>. The two adult classes meeting at 9:45 A.M. were again ably taught by George Rieger and Chuck Smotherman. George's class continues the scripture based study of the beginning of the early Christian Church by following Luke with the study of Acts. Chuck's class draws both adult and high school youth and is teacher generated, also targeting Acts with an open discussion forum using NIV commentary and a reformed theology by Simon Kistemaker.

The Middlers met Sunday mornings at 9:45 A.M. with Marcy Wood, assisted by Christina Conrad, teaching from a David C. Cook curriculum for the second year. They are also gathering on Sunday evening with our current youth leader Steven Lehmann at 6:00 P.M. The senior highs followed at 7:00 P.M. with their youth group gathering.

The Youth had a busy year hosting a Souper Bowl of Caring with proceeds going to the Portage Food Pantry. They produced a Pancake Breakfast to defray expenses of their retreat and ski trip in February with a portion of money raised sent to Haitian Relief. Sue Mihalo, Rev. Leach, Bob Hartmann and Mark Lecy came along as chaperones for the ski trip. Babysitting services were provided for the Sandpiper Wine Tasting Event in May. Steve Lehmann organized a trip to a Christian Rock Concert. Late summer brought a lock in at the church to paint and create a new youth room and a trip to West Beach for some environmental cleanup. November saw their much needed help in promoting and assisting in the food drive for the Portage Food Pantry.

Two elementary classes met, K, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> graders and a class for 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4th and 5<sup>th</sup> graders, using a curriculum called Faith Weavers incorporating Bible lessons with the lives of our children. The fall concentrated on the Old Testament and the winter on the New Testament. With well thought out scripts each week and good resource material, we are able to use a rotation of teachers. We appreciate the willingness of the church community to step into the role of teacher and mentor, and hope it has been as rewarding for those who have taught as for the children in the classes.

Jayne Mann continued with the Kids of the Kingdom and God's Messengers, a K-5th grade age group on Wednesday's at 4-4:45 and performances once a month during worship.

Vacation Bible School in June brought all hands on deck for a visit to the High Seas. Sixty plus children walked up the gangplank and into five days of great adventures sailing, singing, snacking and learning. They reveled in the efforts of a wide range of volunteers who had spent countless hours setting the stage. The boat in the sanctuary was truly inspired. The Friday evening ice cream social and musical finale proved a fitting conclusion to a wonderful week. Many, many thanks to all who gave so much of their time and talents.

Our CE Program aspires to nurture both faith and personal development for all levels of our youth as well as adults and their desire to deepen their faith through study and reflection.

The challenges ahead will include updates not only to the physical property we call the church, but also to the means we use to communicate. # Stewardship Committee Report 2010

2010 was certainly a year of change at ODCC. With Pastor Leach leaving unexpectedly in July, and being without a pastor until November, 2010 was a year of challenge for the Session and the Committees of the church.

Thankfully, the Stewardship Committee is happy to report that we were able to end the year with a financial surplus. I would like to point out several of the highlights of the 2010 financial statement.

The 2010 budget for the Church projected expenses to be \$224,256.50. The actual expenditures of the Church for 2010 totaled \$195,969.31. This reduced spending was thanks to two major factors: The prudent spending of our resources by the committees of the Church and to a large extent the money saved in personnel expenses for the time we were without a pastor.

On the income side of the ledger the Church collected \$7,560 this year that is pledges for 2011. The combination of reduced expenses and the extra income coming from the 2011 pledges helped the Church end the year with a \$29,011.87 surplus.

ODCC started 2010 with assets of \$272,234.37. This is the total of \$139,620.99 in the corporate account and \$132,613.38 in Endowment Fund assets. The end of the year figures are as follows: Corporate Account \$168,617.92, Endowment Fund \$135,308.64, for a total of \$303,926.56. This represents a gain of \$31,692.19.

Consecration Sunday was held on October 31, with a celebration brunch served in the fellowship hall after the 10:45 service. The Committee wants to thank Chuck Smotherman for his volunteering to coordinate the event and all of the hard work he put in to making it a success. 2011 pledges total \$167,449 with 67 pledging units as of this date.

An important function of the Stewardship Committee is advising Session on formulation of a budget for the Church each year. For 2011 the budget mirrors that of 2010. The largest change is a savings due to employing an interim pastor. Church employees did not receive a raise again this year. All of the committees and employees of the Church should be praised for their hard work to contain costs for the last several years.

The Stewardship Committee consists of Walter Sampson, Jane Dickey, Al Johnson and Ken Engel. Al Johnson is also the Financial Secretary of the Church and his accounting expertise and hard work are invaluable assets to the Committee and the Church. We would like to thank Dena Lecy for volunteering to help the Committee as needed and office manager, Brenda Sprengel for her prompt and accurate responses to any questions the Committee posed to her.

It has been an honor to be able to serve with the Stewardship Committee and we all look forward to serving the Lord as stewards of His treasures on earth here at ODCC in 2011.

# Worship Committee

Worship Attendance: The average weekly attendance for 2010 was 29 at the 8:30 service and 69 at the 10:45 service. Maundy Thursday had an attendance of 49. Christmas Eve had a 4:30 service, attendance was not recorded and a 9:00 service of 152. Easter had an attendance of 132. (These numbers do not include 1- 8:30 and 1- 10:45 service as they were not recorded.) Greeters were secured by Margo Hartman.

Summer Schedule: The summer schedule lasted 12 weeks. Lemonade and coffee were served between services, a time for the entire congregation to be together. Ken Engel graciously did the set-up with Dave Larson and Bill Bailey setting the sound system. Libby Larson directed the music.

Special Services: Maundy Thursday had an attendance of 49. The youth lead service was on rally day in September. Steven Lehman worked with the youth and total attendance was 103. Worship designated a "Homecoming Sunday" in the fall. Pastor Emeriti a Nancy Becker preached and special invitations were extended to members and friends of the church. A homecoming lunch was held outside following the service and attendance was recorded at 160.

Pulpit Supply: Rev. Leach filled the pulpit for the initial 6 months. Following resignation, the pulpit was filled by Brad Harry, Mark Kilmer, Rev. Marge Egger, Tom Becker, Dr. Mike Becker, Rev. Nancy Becker, Phil Smith, Leigh Morris, Chuck Smothermon, Steven Lehman, Elder Alice Yacullo, Johanna McCune Wagner, and Marcia Smith-Wood, Rev. Don Neely and Rev. Jack Hess. Monica Conrad and Laura Hannon partnered to find these folks along with help from the Wabash Presbytery. Worship committee members "hosted" them.

Communion Services: Communion was served 10 Sundays and on Maundy Thursday. Judy Selund organized the set-up and Lolly Dogan secured the servers.

Liturgists: Worship was lead by clergy and lay persons. Two training sessions were held lead by Rev. Robert Leach, Laura Hannon and Jayne Mann. Carol Smith converted the communication to an e-mail format and people are able to sign themselves up. Jayne Mann, Robert Hartman and Laura Hannon wrote the liturgy when needed. We focused on youth participation during worship and

added visuals during the offering to show outreach of the church. Recorded music was used that youth chose.

# **SANDPIPER COOPERATIVE PRESCHOOL 2010-2011**

Sandpiper Cooperative Preschool is 36 years old this year. The preschool serves 3, 4, and 5 year olds from Ogden Dunes and the surrounding communities. Our current enrollment is 11 children in the 3 day class and 12 children in the 2 day class. Our enrollment has increased dramatically since 2008 and we are 1 spot short of full enrollment (12 per class). We are confident that next year we will meet this goal. Class is in session in the southwest corner of the building five mornings a week from 9 am to 11:30 am. The classroom consists of two teachers; myself and a teacher's assistant. One parent coops every Wednesday and Thursday.

The mission of Sandpiper is to offer a nurturing environment that is designed to help enhance the child's self-image, further develop positive socialization skills, and strengthen concept formation and motor skills. We accomplish this by following a daily schedule that is enhanced with age appropriate activities set in a welcoming, print rich, learning environment. Our curriculum is a literacy-based program in which reading, letter and sound recognition, language and vocabulary are all a part of every school day.

We are following the literacy program, "zoo-phonics", a kinesthetic method for teaching phonics, reading, and spelling, using literature. Last year we were very pleased with the results. Spanish is also a part of our curriculum. Once a week both classes are introduced to the Spanish language through music, literacy, and math.

During the Fall of 2010 we attended two field trips; the apple orchard and the pumpkin patch. Coming up in early 2011 we have plans to visit the Hageman Library in Porter and a trip to the puppet show at the Center for Visual and Performing Arts in Munster. We will also be going on a field trip to a local grocery store where we will learn about healthy eating. We plan on ending our school year in May with a field trip to the Curious Kids museum in St. Joe or the HealthWorks museum in South Bend.

The Sandpiper board is made up of four volunteer parents who work together with the teachers to provide a meaningful experience for the children. The funding for the preschool comes primarily from tuition paid by the parents of the students and fundraising. The majority of the expenses are the teacher's salary, materials and supplies and rent for our classroom space. Sandpiper families held two fundraisers this past spring and summer; Beach Pictures and a Wine Tasting Event held at the Ogden Dunes Firehouse. We were pleased to receive again a grant from Ogden Dunes Community Church Endowment Fund for continuing education opportunities for the teachers and to update the backyard area of the church.

We thank you for your continued support of this important children's program.

# Ogden Dunes Community Church Endowment Fund 2010 Report

The ODCC Endowment Committee for 2010 consisted of Stewardship Committee chair, Ken Engel; Financial Secretary of the Church, Allen Johnson; and members at large: Deana Lecy and Carolyn Saxton.

The ODCC Endowment Fund is a charitable trust established in 1976 with the purpose of encouraging the friends and members of the Church to make financial contributions to help sustain and promote the life and works of the Church. The trust agreement states that no part of the principal of the Fund may be distributed; only the income produced by the assets of the Fund is available for distribution.

The Endowment Fund started the year with a balance of \$132,613.38. The ending balance for the account was \$135,308.64. The investments of the Fund are held in an account at Wells Fargo and Certificates of Deposit at 1<sup>st</sup> Source Bank.

In 2010 the Endowment Fund had \$6,600 to distribute per the procedures for distribution of growth in the Fund enacted in 2008. Grant requests were solicited and three were received. The grants were as follows: Worship / Property Committees, \$1,500 for design and the first year maintenance of a new church web site; Sandpiper Cooperative Preschool, \$2,000 for continuing education for its teachers and a new play set for behind the Church; Liz Daniel / Kids Alive International up to \$6,600 toward the budget needed for Liz Daniel's upcoming mission trip.

The Worship / Property Committees were awarded the \$1,500 requested with the understanding that a Technology Committee be established or a standing Committee take over responsibility for the new website. Sandpiper was awarded the \$2,000 requested. The Endowment Committee awarded up to \$3,100, based on need, to fulfill Liz Daniels' budget for her upcoming mission trip. As of the writing of this report the Committee has not received a follow up from Kids Alive International as to the amount of money still needed for Liz's budget.
