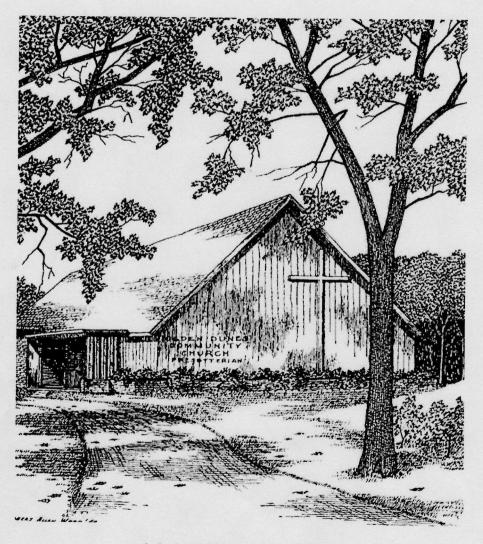

It is hard to believe that one year has passed. The polar vortex is behind us (hopefully). A special thanks to those who took care of the snow at the parsonage; to the congregation, for their support during my recovery and to all who prayed for Barbara and I during this time.

I spent the past year observing. I wanted to learn how things were done and to be informed about the function of each department. I wanted you to become more acquainted with me, my leadership style, my theological beliefs, etc. I believe at this point there is a <u>basic</u> mutual understanding of each other.

Some of the things which were accomplished in 2014 include the following:

- <u>Prayer</u> in sanctuary 4 times a week. This is voluntary.
- A summary of what we believe through <u>The Five Solas</u> in the bulletin.
- Wrote 2 manuals one for elders, the other for Deacons.
- Conducted <u>Training Seminars</u> for both Elders and Deacons.
- A Weekly Devotional sent via e-mail.
- A Mid-week Bible Class.
- "<u>Power Night</u>" on Wednesdays between Bible Class. First Power Night had an Israeli soldier sharing about the conflict in Israel; Second Power Night was during Advent, my wife and Amy Norris did a short dramatic presentation with songs.
- 30 pieces of silver for Missions.
- A Prayer Vigil for 12 hours during Holy Week using a special prepared Prayer Manual.
- Communion to shut-ins.
- Prior to Easter, <u>contacted families</u> with children for the sole purpose of having the children participate in the Easter Celebration.
- 4th of July <u>Patriotic</u> <u>Service</u>.
- Received 13 into membership.
- Consistent <u>visitation program</u> of our elderly and sick and those in Nursing Homes and Assisted Living.

- Minister to a number of <u>people in Ogden Dunes</u> who needed and asked for prayer (not members of the church).
- Obtain a Grant for New Cushions for the Sanctuary.

Added to the aforementioned list are the accomplishments of each department. Their diligent faithfulness is reflected in their reports which include Vacation Bible School, a Ski Trip, Pumpkin Run, etc. Nothing is accomplished without team effort. We thank God for our Church Family Team!

Report of Christian Education Committee

For some time, we at Ogden Dunes Church have struggled with the decline of young families being active in the church and the effect this has had on our Christian Education Program. Because we have lacked sufficient numbers of children and youth in the church, we have not had a substantial Sunday School Program for some time. With some young families starting to attend, and in anticipation of more coming in the future, starting in September of 2014, we implemented a Sunday School Plan to meet the needs of those families that do attend church.

Because there is a small number of children of different age groups we decided to use a "one room school" approach in order to meet the needs of those who are presently attending. As the number of students grows, we hope to be able to provide classes for each age group. Currently, we are set up to minister to children in the K-Grade 3 age group with a rotating schedule for teachers. The rotating teacher schedule allows teachers to attend worship on a somewhat regular basis.

The material used comes from a free online source titled TLDK Sunday school. It is not only scripturally based but is based on the understanding that the Bible is the Inspired Word of God. The curriculum consists of Bible stories found in books from Genesis to Revelation as well as topical studies. Each lesson requires a minimal amount of prep time, so it is teacher friendly. Included in the lesson plans are stories, crafts, memory verses, games, and puzzles.

The committee would like to thank Joy Newton for discovering this material and pointing it out to us. We also are grateful to the members listed here for their willingness to answer the call to minister to our children: Bob and Margo Hartmann, Mark and Deana Lecy and family, Cheryl and Ken Engel, Claudia and Butch Kleywig, Jeri Kris, Amy Norris, Barbara Sewdin, Jacque Nagy, Joy Newton, and Jill Wirth.

We also want to thank George Rieger for his faithfulness in teaching the Adult Bible Study in Sunday mornings from 9-9:45 a.m. each Sunday. During the past year, George led studies in Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, Philemon 1 and 2 Thessalonians, and 1 Timothy. The average attendance is 7 and we know that George has room for more so he looks forward to seeing you in the church parlor on Sundays.

Thanks to Mark and Deana Lecy, with the assistance of chaperones, the annual Youth Ski Trip was held and enjoyed by all in attendance. Dave and Samantha Larson were also in attendance with Dave doing a splendid job of leading devotions.

As yet, we are still in the search process of finding a Youth Director for the Church. We are praying that God would raise someone up for this position.

Vacation Bible School was held on June 9-13 from 9:00 a.m.-11:30 a.m. each day with a closing celebration held on Friday evening. The theme of V.B.S. was Weird Animals from Group Publishing. It was well received and fun for all. Upon the suggestion of staff and helpers we will extend the time from 9:00 a.m. -12:00 p.m. There were 44 students in attendance. We want to thank all the people who came forward to make this event possible and successful.

Stewardship Committee Report

For the last three years, the work of stewardship and missions has been combined into one committee under the title of Mission and Stewardship. In 2015, the ministries of mission and stewardship will be separated into Mission as a separate committee and Stewardship will be combined with Budget and Finance.

This report will reflect only the ministry of stewardship with the ministry of mission being on a separate report. While stewardship itself and mission are year round activities at Ogden Dunes Church, we have held an annual fall stewardship campaign. Ogden Dunes Community Church Finance 2014 Report

The Ogden Dunes Community Church optimistically began 2014 anticipating wondrous opportunities as we moved forward with our new full-time pastor. However, financial challenges were expected as shown by a 2014 budget that reflected a deficit of \$34,000. 2014 numbers are in and based on a simplistic calculation of receipts and expenditures, the Church ended the year \$250.94 in the black. Backing out receipts not available to meet day to day expenses (Memorial Garden Contributions for example) and receipts which are specifically earmarked for 2015 expenditures (Grant received to partially cover new sanctuary seat cushions for example), the Church ended 2014 with a deficit of \$9,195.31.

General Offering receipts were notably strong. At \$71,667.65 they more than doubled an aggressive budget of \$35,000. The Church also received over \$31,128 in specific gifts, both restricted and unrestricted that can not all be expected to reoccur. Please see the attached list:

SANDPIPER COOPERATIVE PRESCHOOL - 2014-2015

Sandpiper Cooperative Preschool is 41 years old this year. The preschool serves 3, 4, and 5 year olds from Ogden Dunes and the surrounding communities. Our current enrollment is 10 children in the 3 day class and 12 children in the 2 day class. Our enrollment has increased dramatically since 2008. Class is in session in the southwest corner of the building five mornings a week from 9 am to 11:30 am. The classroom consists of two teachers; myself and a teacher's assistant. One parent co-ops every Wednesday and Thursday.

The mission of Sandpiper is to offer a nurturing environment that is designed to help enhance the child's self-image, further develop positive socialization skills, and strengthen concept formation and motor skills. We accomplish this by following a daily schedule that is enhanced with age appropriate activities set in a welcoming, print rich, learning environment. Our curriculum is a literacy-based program in which reading, letter and sound recognition, language and vocabulary are all a part of every school day.

We are following the literacy program, "zoo-phonics", a kinesthetic method for teaching phonics, reading, and spelling, using literature. In past years we have been very pleased with the results. Nature based activities are also a part of our curriculum. I have participated in workshops and have purchased many books to help provide the best age appropriate activities to Sandpiper. We are back to incorporating the MusikGarten program into our curriculum. We are able to have this again with the help of Nicole Feeley. Nicole was my assistant 2009-2013. She left Sandpiper for a year, and we are very lucky to have her back. This program helps with language development, movement/large motor skill, pattern recognition, listening skills, as well as the eye-hand coordination associated with playing musical instruments.

During the fall of 2014 we attended four field trips; the apple orchard, the pumpkin patch, a trip to the Indiana Dunes National Lakeshore -Douglas Center and a visit to Chesterton Feed where we were introduced to Jordon the 52lb. turkey. We also had an educational visitor, Chuck the Beeman, who spent the morning teaching us about bees. In January both of our classes will be spending an entire morning at Hageman Library in Porter. In February we will be working on healthy bodies and visiting a local grocery store. In March we have plans to visit the Center for Visual and Performing Arts in Munster for a puppet show about Aesop's Fables. Coming up, we will be studying embryology. We will be hatching baby chicks from fertilized eggs that I will pick up in Hobart. This is always a class and parent favorite. April will be all about trains and we'll conclude this unit with a train safety presentation and a train ride from "Little Obie". We also have plans for Mr. Abe, an Outreach Educator for the Recycling and Waste Reduction District of Porter County to visit us and teach us about ladybugs. This past December, we participated in the church's angel tree by donating gifts. We were able to raise money for 6 children. Our students were eager to bring in change for our classroom piggy banks and to give to those children that are less fortunate. We also participated in the Ogden Dunes food drive. Each child in our 3 day class carried a bag of food items and Ms. Nicole pulled a full wagon out to the truck. Our class also has plans to write to two servicemen in the spring. I am always looking for ideas to incorporate "giving" into our curriculum and I am very open to new ideas.

The Sandpiper board is made up of five volunteer parents who work together with the teachers to provide a meaningful experience for the children. The funding for the preschool comes primarily from tuition and fundraising. The majority of the expenses are the teachers' salaries and materials and supplies for our classroom. Sandpiper families held two fundraisers this past year; a spring Wine Tasting Event and a Fall Fun Day both of which were held at the Ogden Dunes Firehouse. The Fall Fun Day served not only as a fundraiser for the school but a portion of the money raised through pledges and donations was donated to the Portage Township Food Pantry. We have also been grateful to receive a grant from the Ogden Dunes Community Fund. The money received went towards a science table, rain gauge, birdhouse and a nature magazine subscription.

We thank you for your continued support of this important children's program. My personal goal at Sandpiper is to have each child leave school wanting to come back.
