## The Pastor's Pen "Thanksgiving"

The words "thank" and "think" come from the same root, reminding us that thanksgiving comes from thinking about our blessings. Thant's what David did in Psalm 34. He declared: "Bless the Lord at all times, I sought the Lord and He heard me and delivered me from all my fears."

As the 90-ton <u>Mayflower</u> sailed from the New World on August 5, 1620, the 102 Pilgrims huddled in dark, low-ceiling holds. The Pilgrims prayed and praised during their seven-week voyage. Upon landing "they fell upon their knees and blessed the God of heaven, who had brought them over the furious ocean and delivered them from all their perils and miseries..."

God deserves our thanksgiving too. He calms our storms and guides us to our desired haven. America's greatness is due to the deep convictions of her founders. Unfortunately, many have forgotten that half the Pilgrims died during their first winter in Plymouth. The onset of Spring found them wondering if any of them would survive, but that's when God intervened. An Indian named Squanto taught the Pilgrims how to catch eels, plant corn and survive by stalking deer, refining maple syrup, using herbs for medicine and trading beaver pelts. Without him, the Plymouth Colony would not have survived, and that's why at the end of growing season the Pilgrims and Indians celebrated Thanksgiving.

Similarly, our heavenly Father knows our needs before we ask and at unexpected moments, He will send us the right person or provision to help us. Just when you need Jesus, He is near—"ready to secure" says Thomas Jefferson, "when we recognize that those liberties are from God.." That's why we should make everyday a Thanksgiving.

Horatio Alger, Jr., was a 19th century author who wrote more than 130 novels ("divine novels") with one consistent theme: "rags-to-riches" story. Every story told how a poor boy was able to rise to middle-class comfort and security by hard work, perseverance, morality, and good deeds. Alger wrote at a time when the *Continued on page 2*

# Thoughts for Veterans Day

Abraham Lincoln gave his second Inaugural Address on March 4, 1865, as the Civil War

was raging. He said, "Fondly do we hope fervently do we pray —that this mighty scourge of war may speedily pass away." Lincoln's next paragraph is especially appropriate for Veterans Day:

"With malice toward none; with charity for all; with firmness in the right, as God gives us to see the right, let us strive on to finish the work we are in; to bind up the nation's wounds; to care for him who shall have borne the battle, and for his widow and his orphan — to do all which may achieve and cherish a just and lasting peace, among ourselves, and with all nations."

When President Lincoln finished his classic oration, he reportedly kissed the Bible and left the platform. He was assassinated the next month.
