The Pastor's Pen

Sometime ago I read about students at New Mexico State University attacked by hawks as they were walking to class. The hawks had built nests in the trees by the gym and considered the pedestrians threats to their hatchlings. Several students sustained injuries. One was attacked hard enough to suffer from post-concussion symptoms that included dizziness and nausea.

Have you ever been so wronged that you are filled with deep-rooted anger? In the Bible, Joseph was hated by his brothers to the point that they wanted him dead; instead they sold him as a slave. Joseph suffered much as a result but he held no grudge, hatred nor bitterness towards his brothers. Eventually, God blessed him and he became prime minister of Egypt. Twenty years later, there was a severe famine and his brothers came to buy food from him. What would you have done if you were Joseph? Here are three things to consider:

- Our attitude towards others reveals our genuine attitude toward God.
- Angry reactions do not bring about the righteous results God desires.
- True greatness is found on our attitude to those who wronged us. For it is <u>out of who we are</u> that <u>what we will do</u> will flow.

Joseph wasn't born with a godly attitude. He cultivated it. When he revealed his identity to his brothers, he did so from God's perspective (extended forgiveness) and with great compassion (by God's Grace). He replaced his brothers Hatred with Grace. He did not retaliate with punishment. He responded with truth and generosity.

LINGER OVER THIS TRUTH. Let it lead you to the God of all grace who loves YOU overwhelmingly and wants to forgive YOU unconditionally. Isn't it amazing that Jesus who was despised and rejected would work so hard through His death on the Cross to get us reunited with Him? But that is His Nature...Just think about how much God loves you!! What are you going to do about it? Accept it or Reject it?
