## Pastor's Weekly Devotional – January 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019 "The Faithfulness of God"

2018 has been a year of unending turmoil. The tragic killings. Devastating Hurricanes, Tornadoes and Wildfires. Not to mention our personal daily challenges.

On the flip side, there is God. As Christians, we believe that God is in control. We believe that the eternal God is guiding history towards its pre-appointed end and that He has a personal plan for our lives. Thus, there is little to fear if we put our trust in Him.

One word that defines God (among many other words) is FAITHFULNESS. We use the word "faithful" referring to a loyal friend, someone who is dependable, hardworking and keeps his/her promises.
