"Reconnect to God's DSL – the Bible"

A few months ago in Pittsburgh, my internet was down. When Verizon fixed the problem, they found that the problem was at their main connection way "up-the-pole." It seems a squirrel gnawed at the connection (wires) and the water from the rain interrupted the power. As a result, there was not enough power coming to the DSL.

This reminds me that the Bible is the <u>changeless</u> standard God has given to us in a subjective world of flux. It <u>stands</u> alone as the yardstick, the norm, the standard against which all else must be measured. It is "God's Power" that guides us like a compass; that empowers us against the pragmatism of ideologies; and it will, most assuredly, lead to the harbor of life.

Powerless Christians are prayerless Christians. They become unglued easily. They are offended easily. So, it's time to reconnect with God by reading his Word and activating our prayer life.

So let us take our eyes off ourselves. Our egocentricity. Our selfishness. Our pride. Look again at God's word. It is empowering. It is edifying. It offers more than light at "the end of the tunnel" but a life for all eternity.
