Pastor's Weekly Devotional- May 19, 2016

"Won't You Be a Good Neighbor?"

Sometimes commands in the Bible seem <u>reasonable</u> like "love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind and Strength" (<u>Mark</u> 12:30); other times, it seems <u>unreasonable</u> like "love your neighbor as yourself" (<u>Mark</u> 12:31). Often, our natural response to the latter is, "I don't like him much less love him."

"Love him like myself...you are kidding!" Like most Christians, we opt for the corollary to that command – "good fences make good neighbors," meaning "you stay on your side of the fence and I'll stay on mine, with an occasional smile and wave from my driveway." That's what the lawyer had in mind when he asked Jesus: "Who is my neighbor?" (Luke 10:29)

To be "a good neighbor", we begin by modeling God's compassion by making steppingstones down the walls we have built between us:

- Be Available
 Build into your schedule casual opportunities to visit your neighbors.
- Be Involved Model God's grace by involving yourself in service to a particular Project.
- Be Accepting Don't judge. Let your words, actions and lifestyle be your testimony.
- Be Vulnerable Don't act smart! Don't be a "smart-aleck!" Be honest and say: "I don't know!" Your neighbors know you are not perfect.
- Be Compassionate Behind the mask your neighbor wears, know that deep within, something is missing in their hearts.

<u>Prayer</u>

Father, enable me to be your <u>hands</u> to serve others; your <u>feet to help others</u>; your <u>eyes</u> to behold the good of others; your <u>heart to love others as you love them through Jesus</u> Christ our Lord. Amen.
