“Being An Oxymoron”

Can you imagine a major league baseball player leading the league in making the most errors...in being struck out the most times...in hitting into the most double plays – and still being voted Most Valuable Player for that year?

It happened in 1942. Joe Gordon did all those things and still won the MVP award that season in the American League.

So what's the lesson here? Joe Gordon's case shows that even though you have faults, you can overcome them and be recognized for your good points.

If you really want to do something, you'll find a way; if you don't, you'll find an excuse. Successful people don't necessarily have the best of everything. They just make the best of everything.

Benjamin Franklin's view of persuading others to his point-of-view reads like an admonition found in the Bible:

One, Know what you're after.

Two, Do your homework. Research it thoroughly.

Three, Be persistent. Don't give up easily. Hang tough!

Four, Keep your sense of humor.
