## Pastor's Weekly Devotional- October 28, 2015

## "The Unfathomable Depth of God's Love"

When the Trans-Atlantic communication system was being laid from 1856 to 1866, it was discovered that there were ocean depths which no one was able to fathom; that is, <u>unable</u> "to measure or to probe." The workmen had dropped a line 2,000 fathoms (1 fathom equals 6 feet) and the line did not reach the ocean floor. As a result, this depth was called "unfathomable."

Similarly, the depth of God's love <u>for you</u> is beyond human comprehension. It is unfathomable. It is beyond measure. Job rightly said: "Can you fathom the mysteries of God? Can you probe the limits of the Almighty?" (11:7) Who has not longed for love? Which spouse has not sought security, desired affection, only to end up empty-handed and empty-hearted?

Here's good news! You can find security in God's love for you. His love does not vacillate. It's <u>not</u> up one day and down the next day. You can fathom God's love for you by looking at His Son – the Lord Jesus Christ. Through His death, He <u>redeemed</u> you; He <u>delivered</u> you and <u>liberated</u> you from all your sins – past, present and future. His love never fails. It is forgiving, freeing and fathomless.

The most poetic expression of God's unfathomable love was written by a man who died in an asylum. These words were found scribbled on the wall beside his bed:

Could we with ink the ocean fill,
And were the skies of parchment made,
Were every stalk on earth a quill, and every man a scribe by trade.
To write the love of God above would drain the ocean dry,
Nor could the scroll contain the whole,
Though stretched from sky to sky.
O love of God, how rich, how pure! How measureless and strong!
It shall forevermore endure the saints' and angels' song.
